, once the debris had been cleared, the remains of the fortress were visible.

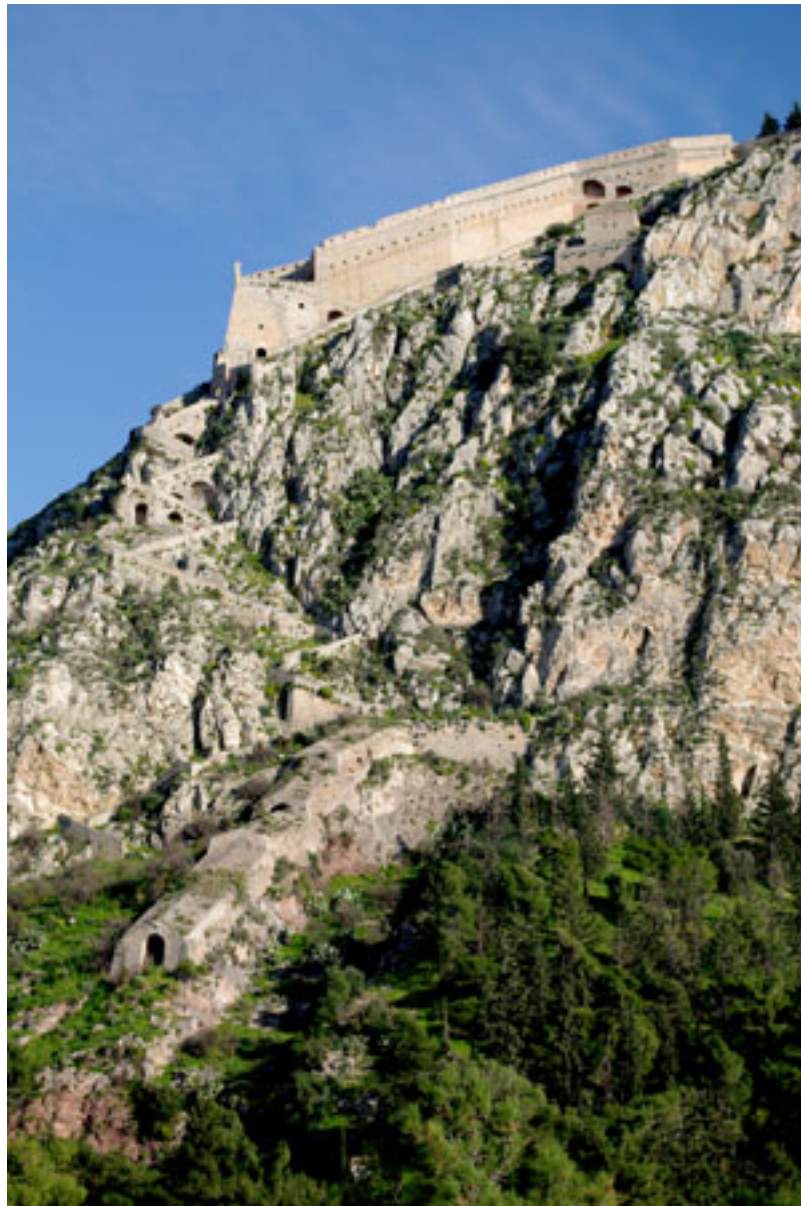
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**From then on, every year on this date** the city is celebrated with a service in this historic chapel.
