During the Late Bronze Age, Tiryns fortified and by Argolid, it is considered to be the most powerful city in the Argolid peninsula.

Pausanias, who visited Tiryns in the 2nd century AD, described the site as a place of great beauty and interest. He mentioned the famous Tiryns Lion, a large stone sculpture of a lion, which is now in the Louvre Museum.
